



Message from the Secretary



With the commemoration of the Day of Affirmation of Argentina's Rights Over the Malvinas on June 10, and the session of the United Nations Special Committee on Decolonization on June 23, the "Malvinas 40 Years" Agenda has reached its climax and is being developed towards the second semester with great dynamism and vitality.

I would like to highlight that Malvinas has become a priority in the presidential speeches delivered in three areas of high international visibility, such as the Summit of the Americas, the BRICS and the G7. In the first two, the President referred to the Malvinas Question as a case of colonialism pending resolution, he reaffirmed Argentine sovereignty and thanked the countries that support the call to the United Kingdom to respect international law.

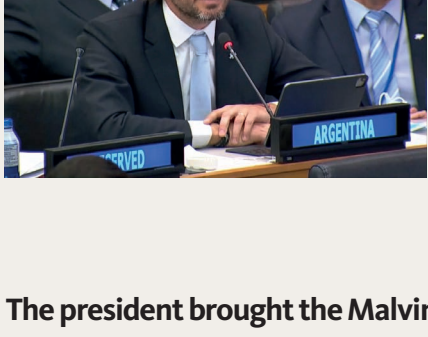
The emphasis placed on the Malvinas Question by the current administration is nothing more than an expression of a state policy that is based on our traditional foreign policy and on the provisions of the National Constitution. At the same time, it shows the outstanding role played by Argentina in favor of respect to international law, the end of colonialism and peace.

The Special Committee on Decolonization approved by consensus the resolution on Malvinas

Within the framework of the session dedicated exclusively to the treatment of the Question, Santiago Cafiero made a strong call to the United Kingdom to resume bilateral negotiations with our country in order to find a peaceful and definitive solution to the sovereignty dispute over the islands, as established by the UN mandate and has been requested by numerous multilateral organizations since 1983.



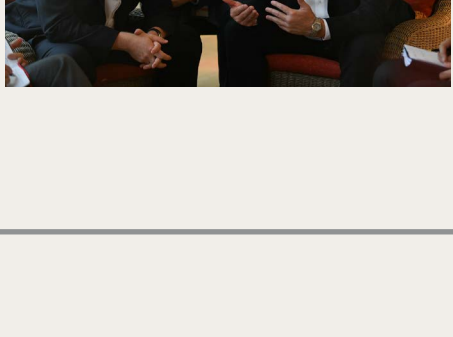
The president brought the Malvinas Question to the Ninth Summit of the Americas

President Alberto Fernández attended the Ninth Summit of the Americas, held in the city of Los Angeles, where he spoke as Pro Tempore President of the Community of Latin American and Caribbean States (CELAC). In his speech, he called for a Latin America without exclusions, demanded the restructuring of the OAS and highlighted the claim for sovereignty over the Malvinas Islands, among other concepts.

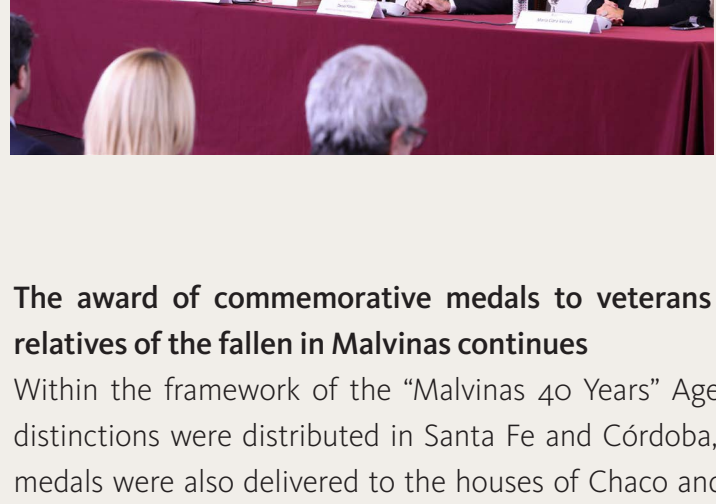


The president held a bilateral meeting with Boris Johnson and demanded that he resume negotiations for the Malvinas

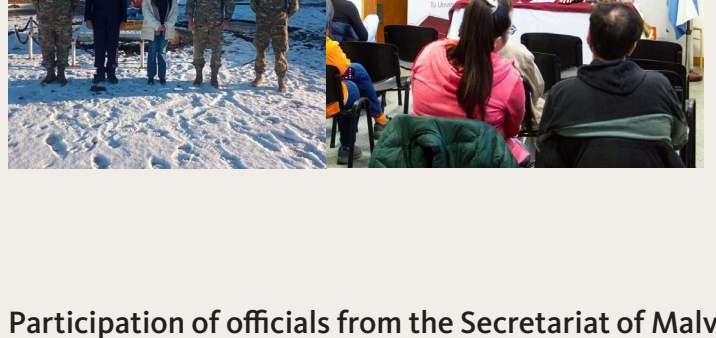
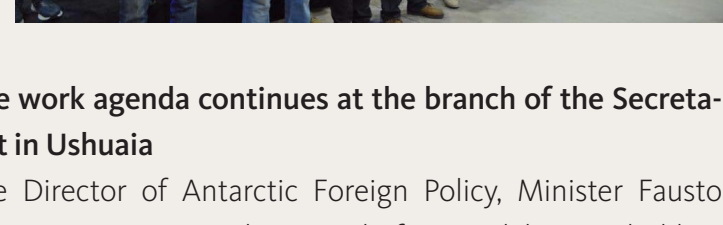
June 10: The national government reaffirmed Argentine rights over Malvinas

The ceremony for the Day of Affirmation of Argentina's Rights Over the Malvinas, South Georgias, South Sandwich Islands and the Corresponding Maritime and Insular Areas was held at the San Martín Palace, and was attended by the Secretary of Malvinas, Antarctica and the South Atlantic, Guillermo Carmona, the Minister of Defense, Jorge Taiana, and the Minister of Science, Technology and Innovation, Daniel Filmus, as well as deputies, senators, heads of the Armed Forces and foreign ambassadors.

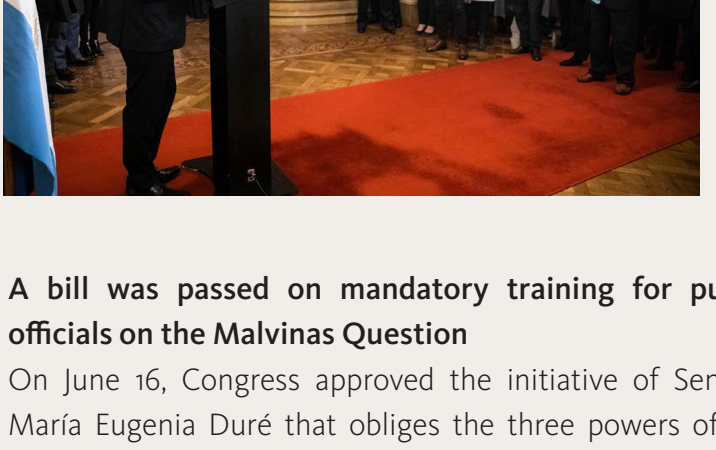


The work agenda continues at the branch of the Secretariat in Ushuaia

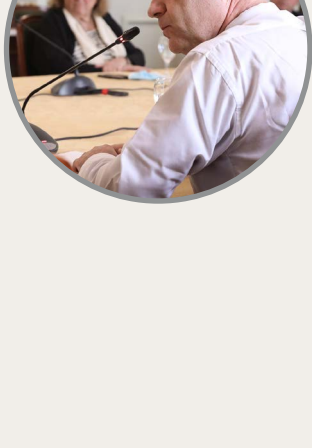
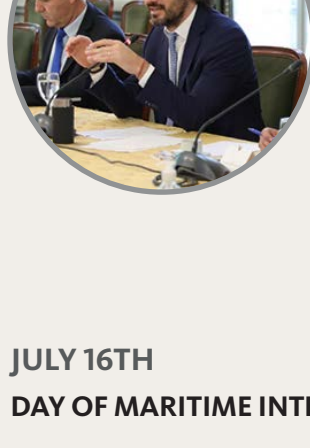
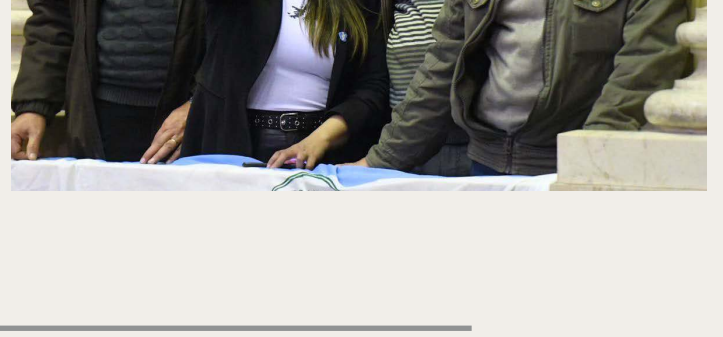
The Foreign Ministry presented a sample of historical documents on the Malvinas Question

A bill was passed on mandatory training for public officials on the Malvinas Question

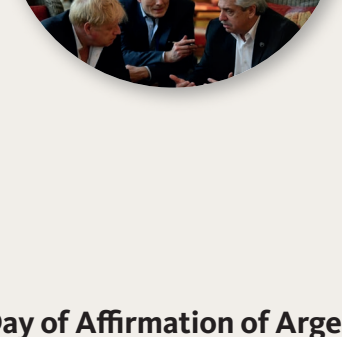
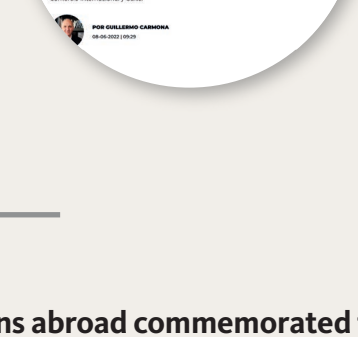
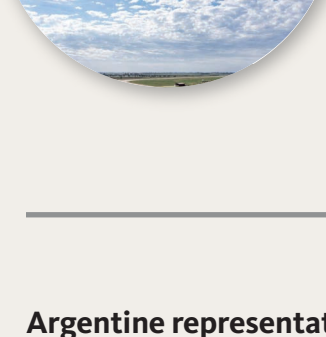
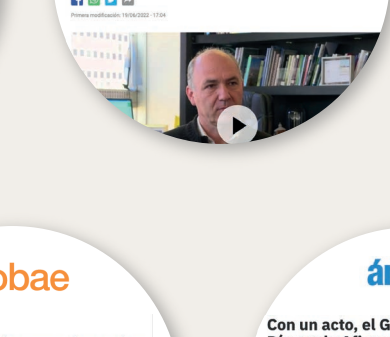
